## Project Spotlight – Amangiri Resort, Lake Powell Utah

This is exactly what we have hidden in a canyon on the shores of Wahweep at Lake Powell, the Amangiri Resort. "When I mention rarity, it truly is and is one of only seven in the world. The resort has 34 guest suites and 31 private ownership villas. Lots range from 1.3 to 10 acres while the entire project sits on 600 acres.

The project was started in 2006 by the Infrastructure group, with the installation of all the necessary underground conduits for Garkane Power and other utilities. From then until now, a truly unique and beautiful resort has been poured into place. It is built right into the rocks blending seamlessly with the beauty of the wild desert. Amangiri Resort features stunning architecture that is topped with beautiful stone of deep greens.

As your eyes wander you see various water features of all sizes and shapes. The facility will boast a World Class Chef coupled with a world class kitchen. It is also fitted with a Spa and Exercise facility and some of the most unique saunas and steam rooms. When you're finished with your workout, you can grab refreshment from the Wine Room or simple pleasure from the Humidor.
